The Rock River Valley Tooling and Machining Association (RRVTMA) is offering two \$2,500 scholarships to high school seniors graduating in Spring 2022. This offering supports a focus of our association's mission, namely, "promoting and emphasizing education". It is our hope that awarding scholarships to high school seniors pursuing a manufacturing related degree program will encourage more young people to pursue careers in manufacturing.

SCHOLARSHIP CRITERIA

- Individual who is a high school senior graduating in 2022
- Primary residence must be in Winnebago, Boone, Ogle, Stephenson or Whiteside County in Illinois or Rock or Walworth County in Wisconsin
- Must be a U.S. citizen or documented permanent resident of the United States
- Intended course of study is in a manufacturing technology or manufacturing engineering related major
- Plan to attend a community college, technical college or four-year college or university
- In an essay, state your interest in a manufacturing industry career, what event or series of events led you to this decision and your specific career goals after graduation from college
